
Kitchen Maintenance and Care Guide

Care Instructions:

Craft development Ltd only uses quality materials backed by its suppliers.

Never use any of the following abrasive cleaners: Jif, Ajax, Chemico, Brasso, oven cleaners, neat Janola, wire wool, scourer pads, sandpaper.

General Care:

Kitchen daily use should be careful of heat and steam.

Always wipe off any water and condensation from the fronts and sides of units and any accidental spills. Do not expose your doors and panels to high levels of heat, moisture, steam or humidity. Do not use your kettle, toaster or other heat emitting appliances directly below, behind or next to overhead doors.

Cleaners should be used with caution. Always test on an inconspicuous area first.

The surface of the door panel should be protected from sharp objects.

Make sure the cabinet inside shelves (or shelf pins) are in the correct position.

Reasonable use. You are responsible for looking after the goods.

Cleaning:

- A soft cloth should always be used, apply cleaning products to the cloth rather than directly onto the product. Don't use hard bristle (e.g. nylon/bamboo) brushes, scourers, abrasives, scrapers, blades, steel wool or sharp tools when cleaning.
- Wash down with warm water with a small amount of detergent. For best results use streak free glass cleaner with a soft cloth.
- For textured finishes (pearl, woodgrain and puregrain) the periodic use of a soft brush may be necessary for the removal of dirt build-ups and residues left by some spray on cleaners.
- Please do not clean the **Acrylic panels** for 72 hours after the protective peel coat is removed. The hardener in the surface needs to be exposed to the air to oxidize and harden the coating.

Spillages:

- Hair rinse, Janola (neat) Harpic, oven cleaners – wash with hot soapy water, then wipe dry.
- Fabric dye – wash with cold water, then wipe dry. Then apply methylated spirits and wipe dry.
- Battery acid, hydrogen peroxide, glue hardeners – wash with cold water then wipe dry.
- Hair dye – wash with methylated spirits then wipe dry.

- Leather dye – wash with methylated spirits then wipe dry. Follow with mineral turpentine, wash and wipe dry.

Stain And Mark Removal:

- Stubborn marks or stains – apply Handy Andy or diluted Janola (one part to three parts water), then wipe down with a warm damp cloth.
- Smearing, finger marks, marking from cold or hot dishes, stickiness – apply one or two applications of acetone (available at pharmacies) and wipe over with a dry cloth.
- Newsprint – use methylated spirits or mineral turpentine
- Rust – use vinegar or lemon juice
- Pencil – use water and a damp cloth
- Felt pen or dry marker - use methylated spirits or acetone
- Paint – use acetone or Duco Lacquer thinners (from a paint shop)
- Glue – contact type – use Ados Solvent N (from a paint shop)
